Swamp Red Maple is widely grown as an ornamental tree in parks and large gardens, and grows well in a wide range of soil conditions. It's popularity in cultivation stems from its vigorous habit (it reaches about 40 to 50 feet in height), its attractive and early red flowers, and most importantly, it's flaming red fall foliage. The red maple is excellent at withstanding harsh urban conditions, including tolerance of both dry and wet soils. Like several other maples, its low root system can be invasive and it makes a poor choice for plantings in narrow strips between a sidewalk and a street, but is perfect in the yard as an attractive ornamental shade tree.



*Caliper is a nursery standard measurement for the diameter of the trunk one foot above the soil .
